CLINTON WATER FORUM

The Clinton Progressive Association is presenting a free forum on water issues affecting wells and septic systems in Clinton, the state of South Whidbey's groundwater, and the effects of pollution on personal and environmental health and on Puget Sound. The forum takes place on Saturday, March 13 from 9:00am to 4:00pm at Clinton Community Hall, Hwy 525 and Central Avenue.

Learn practical tips from presentations, workshops, displays and discussions with local and regional water quality practitioners. This is a wonderful opportunity for all South Whidbey residents to learn from local experts and discuss issues about water on Whidbey that affect them directly.

All participants will receive a free toilet leak test kit. Everyone will be entered in a drawing to participate in an afternoon expedition aboard the Service, Education & Adventure program vessel *Indigo* to learn more about the shoreline surrounding Clinton. Following keynote speaker Nancy Snow's presentation, *Water: What's in it (for us)?* there will be a panel covering water issues affecting wells & septic systems in Clinton, the state of our groundwater, and the effects of pollution on personal & environmental health.

Afternoon workshops include: rain gardens for safe handling of stormwater, compost as a fertilizer and herbicide alternative, and making safe, clean and simple household cleaning products.

Do you know what 'toxicins' are under your kitchen sink, in your laundry room or bathroom? Find out about your cleaning supplies and why they may be harming your septic system and the Puget Sound. Learn to make environmentally-friendly cleaning supplies and take home your own cleaning bucket with supplies. The *Clean and Simple* workshop is offered at half price \$7.50. This is a fabulous opportunity so register today for this fascinating and informative workshop.

Registration opens at 8:30 am at the event, but space is limited, so advance reservations are highly recommended. All presentations are free thanks to a grant from Puget Sound Partnership.
