FOOD: Back to Basics

The first of the FOOD: Back to Basics discussion group was held on Monday Oct 9th when Rebecca Bartsch gave an interesting talk on fermentation. What really got people excited was the tasting session of her many home made products. Ever tasted fermented salmon that was about a week old? Tasted great!

Grange members, regular attendees and a group of first timers all had a new appreciation for an ancient food preservation technique. Thanks very much Rebecca.

The second session will be on Monday Oct 26th 7 pm when Mary Leonard of Island Tree Ranch in Coupeville will be talking about APPLES: how to manage your trees and what to do with the fruit.

The third session, Monday Nov 9th 7 pm will be presented by David Neel of Island Apiaries. He is also president of the Whidbey Island Beekeepers Association and is helping to network bee keepers with people who like the idea of bees on their property but do not want to actually work with the bees.

Final and fourth session for the fall will be on Monday Nov 23rd 7 pm when Georgie Smith of Willowood Farm in Coupeville will be talking about the historic Rockwell dry bean, an heirloom bean unique to Whidbey which is being brought back from the edge of extinction. Her ancestors farmed Ebey's Prairie and grew this bean which was a staple of church suppers and community potlucks.

- · Goats and dairy products; Vickie Brown
- Chickens, small scale eggs and broilers; Stinger Anderson
- Cooking from the Pantry: Healthy meals within your budget; Roberta Hacking.
